

## **Hotel Options**

The designated conference hotel is <u>Jubilee Conference Hotel</u> (pictured below) which has a discounted cost £120 single occupancy with breakfast — use code Medicine2024! when booking. The hotel is a pleasant 25-minute walk across the University campus to the conference venue. Free parking is available at the University for those registered for the conference.

Nottingham is a thriving city with lots of hotel accommodation to suit all budgets. Below are some of the key hotels with typical costs for 1 night, single occupancy without breakfast:

Park Plaza Nottingham (4\*) £80 – City Centre Holiday Inn Nottingham (3\*) £85 – 40min walk to venue Leonardo Hotel (3\*) £73 – next to train/tram stations St James Hotel (3/4\*) £54 – City Centre Hart's Hotel (4\*) £160 – upmarket City Centre Hilton Nottingham (3/4\*) £100 – City Centre
